

Indoors, the fun never stopped. Students enjoyed a variety of games, creative art projects and plenty of shared laughter. These sessions have been just as valuable — offering


opportunities to collaborate, express themselves and unwind together.

# WELLBEING & CODING


Fridays have been very exciting this term with the Expo in Week 1, Halloween dress ups and our Wellbeing excursion to lawn bowls. We had a great time at lawn bowls, learning how to play and then practising our skills. Trying to get the weighted bowl to get near the jack is quite a challenging skill, but it provides quite a bit of entertainment.

In class we have also managed to make some progress in coding using the code.org website. Students have practised directing bots like Angry Birds and farmers through challenges by giving them directions. Some students have even had a go at using 'repeat' blocks to make their coding more efficient.

We have continued to focus on labelling our emotions. Some of the different emotions we have focused on are:

Red	High energy, unpleasant	Angry, frustrated

Green	Low energy, pleasant	Calm, comfortable

In the Purple class we have had a particular focus on learning the signs for these emotions. All emotions are valuable because they tell us things. Green and yellow are the most desirable ways to feel, and the most helpful if we want to have a positive day at school. Doing activities like painting, pickleball and building Lego can help us to feel green or yellow.
